






The British Shorthair

- Sturdy, well built, medium- large, POWERFUL, working cat.
- Slow to reach full maturity and development
- Calm, quiet, easily trained, adaptable

Head

- Large round head set on a short thick neck
- Round, level, well spaced eyes in array of colors to match their coat color.
- Forehead rounded with a slight flat plain on top.



Head


- Medium broad-based ears fitting into skull roundness
- Strong well-developed muzzle and chin. Definite stop beyond round well-developed whisker pads.
- In profile there is a gentle dip.





Body

- Compact, broad chested
- Well muscled, powerful
- Strong short medium legs, large round feet





Coat


- Short, dense, resilient coat.
- Not double coated or woolly
