

KORAT

The Cat That's All Heart!



ESSENCE OF KORAT



- Heart-shaped bone structure of the head
- Considered the 'Good Luck' cat of Thailand
- Coat is single-coated, silver-tipped blue
- No significant changes since acceptance into CFA



POINT BREAKDOWN



HEAD – 25%

- Broad head, profile, eye breadth, ear set/placement, heart shape, chin, jaw

COLOR – 25%

- Body, eyes

BODY – 25%

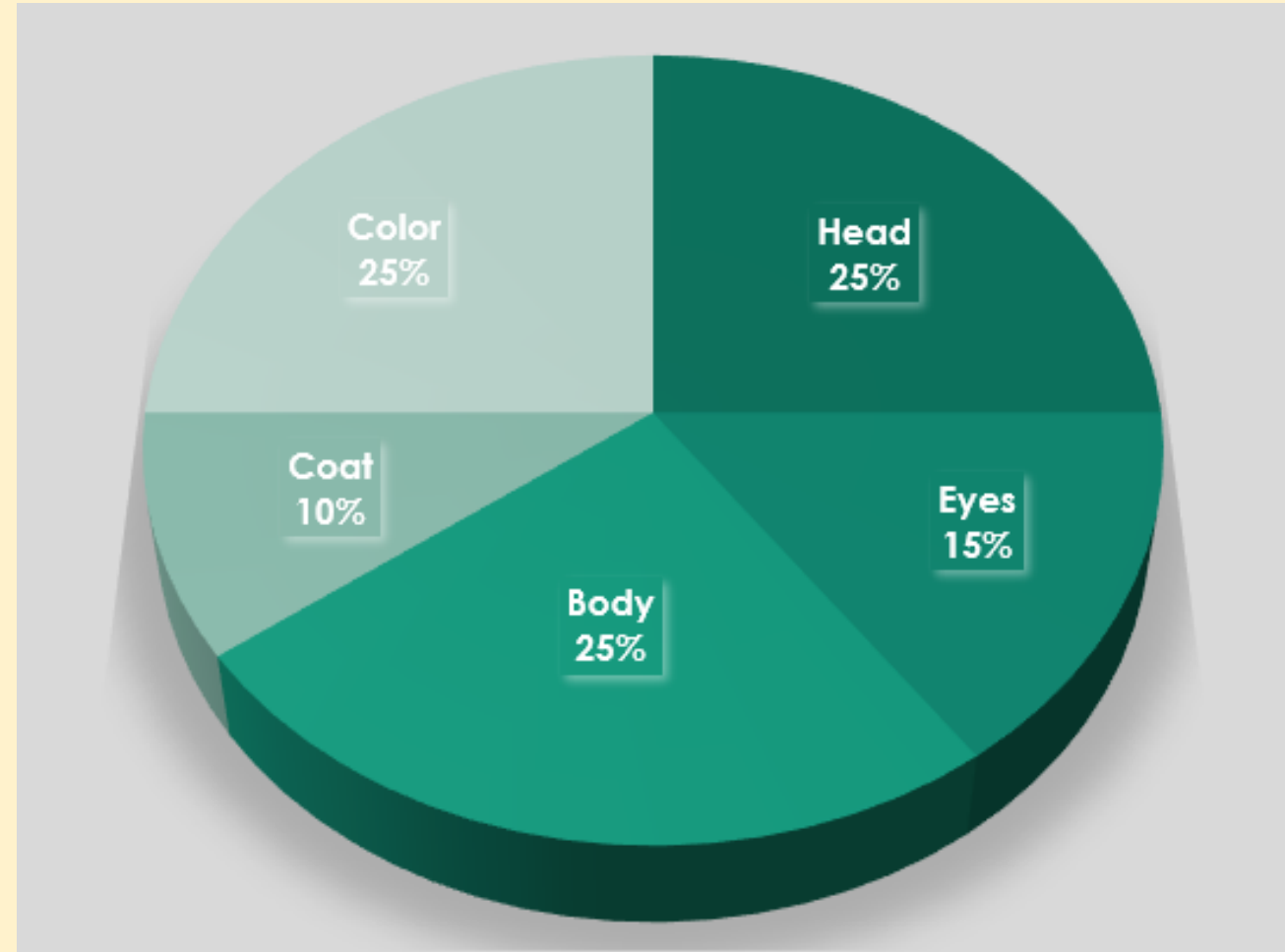
- Body, legs, feet, tail

EYES – 15%

- Size, shape, placement

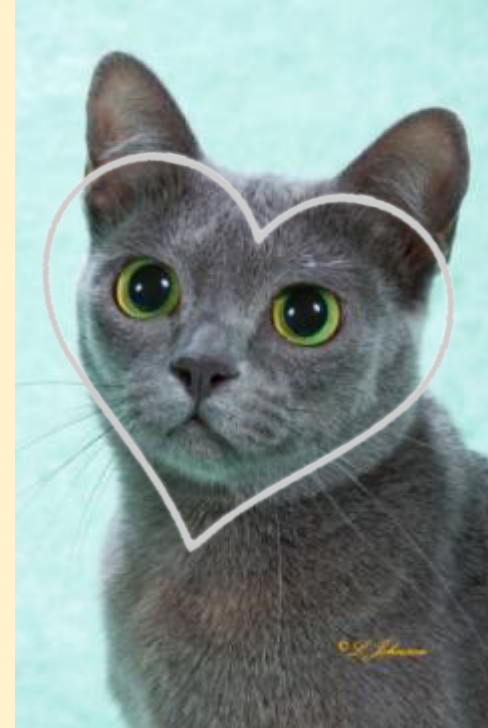
COAT – 10%

- Short, texture, close lying



HEAD

- Heart-shaped bone structure of head
- Broad head, good eye breadth
- Chin and jaw: strong, completes heart shape



HEAD

- Profile: slight stop. Lion-like downward curve
- Ears: large, rounded tip, flared base. Ear hair extremely short and close
- Eyes: large, with depth and brilliance. Wide open appearance.
 - Rounded eye aperture when fully open; Asian slant when closed or partially closed

BODY

- Semi-cobby
- Broad chest
- Muscular, supple feel
- Back carried in curve
- Males tend to be larger than females
- Legs and feet: Front legs slightly shorter than back
- Tail: medium length; heavier at base; taper to round tip



COAT



- Short, single coated, glossy and fine, close to the body
- Coat over spine breaks as cat moves



COLORS



BODY

- Silver-tipped blue producing a silver halo effect
- Ghost tabby markings allowed for kittens

Nose Leather/Lips: dark blue or lavender

Paw Pads: dark blue ranging to lavender with pinkish tinge



COLORS

EYE COLOR

- Luminous green; amber cast allowed
- Kittens and adolescents can have yellow or amber/amber-green eyes. Color normally achieved between 2-4 years old



DISQUALIFY/ALLOWANCES



DISQUALIFY:

- **VISIBLE** kink (non-visible kinks **ARE** permitted)
- Incorrect number of toes
- White spot or locket
- Any color but silver-tipped blue

ALLOWANCES:

- **Non-visible** kinks **ARE** permitted
- Allow ghost tabby markings in color for kittens
- Kittens and adolescents can have yellow to amber or amber-green eye color (eye color can take two to four years of age)

KORAT

The Cat That's All Heart!



- The silver-tipped blue coat produces a halo effect.
- Unique bone structure of head produces a heart shape
- Color can take from 2 to 4 years to fully develop
- Korats come in one color and have no allowable outcross breeds
