The Norwegian Forest Cat is a sturdy, slow-maturing cat with a distinguishing double coat, easily recognizable head & body shape.

- Domesticated in the 1930's in Norway.
- Admitted into CFA's Championship class in 1993.
- Thought to have sailed with the Vikings.
- Norse myths have Freya pulling her sleigh with Norwegian Forest Cats.

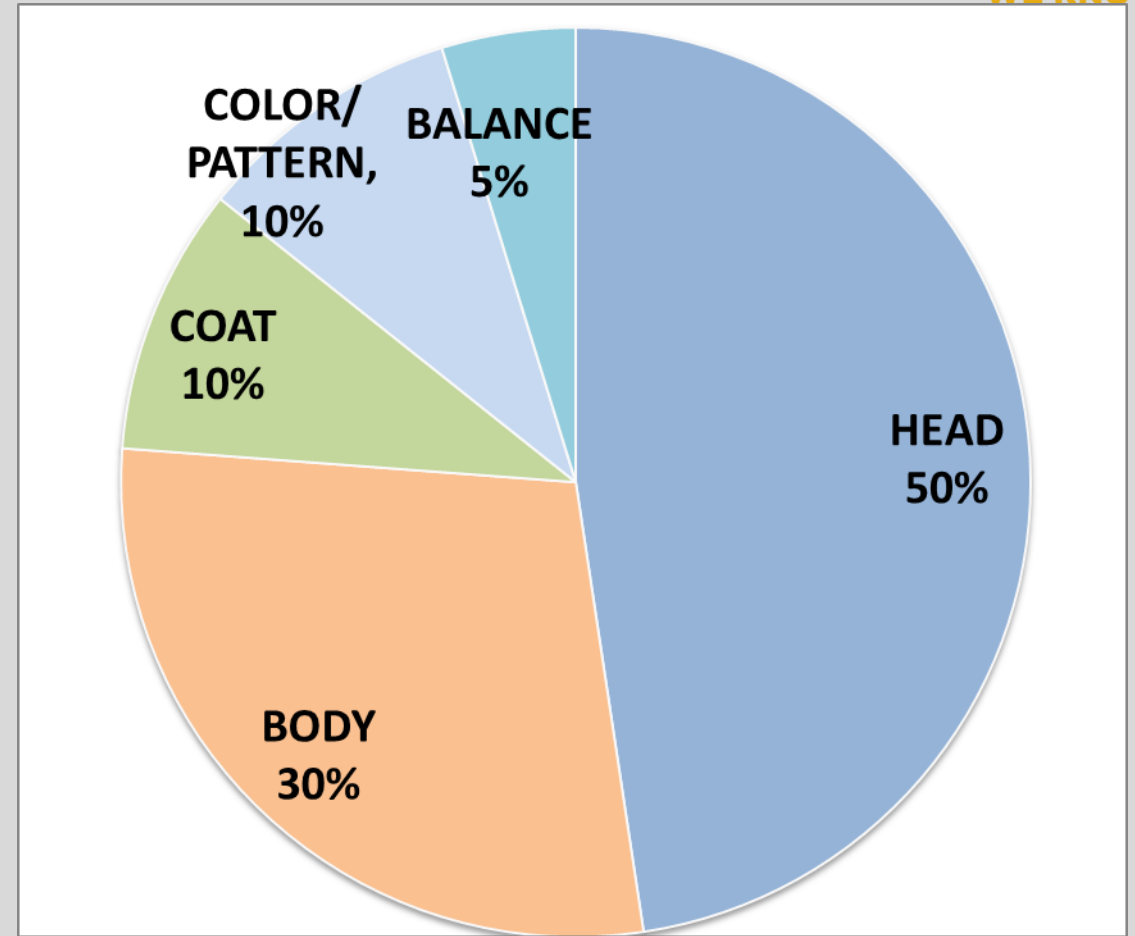

HEAD

HEAD SHAPE: Equilateral triangle

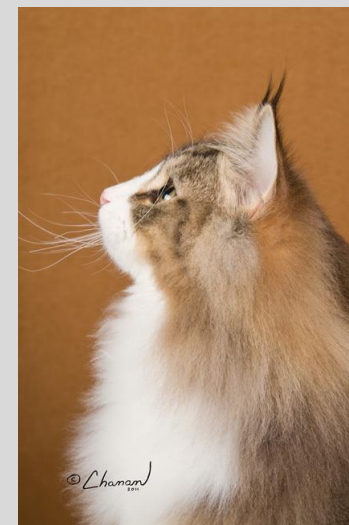
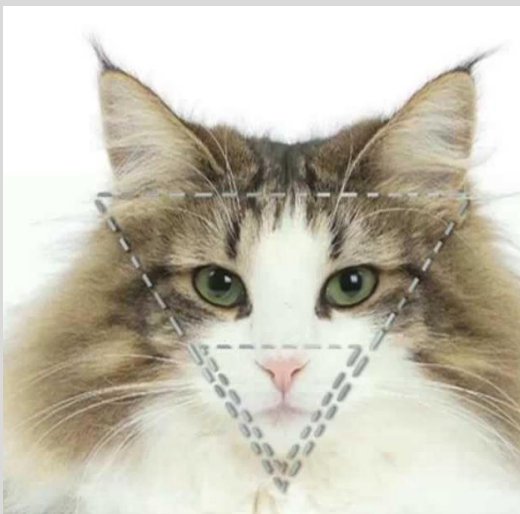
- Outside base of ear to point of chin
- Neck short/heavily muscled

NOSE PROFILE: Straight, without a break from brow ridge to tip of nose

- Flat forehead , gently curved skull & neck

EYES: Large, almond shaped

- Well-opened/expressive
- Slight angle, outer corner higher than inner
- Green, gold, green-gold or copper,
- White or w/white may have blue/odd



HEAD

- **Chin:** gently rounded, in line with nose
- **Muzzle:** part of straight line (base of ear to chin), without whisker pads/pinch
- **Ears:** medium to large, rounded tip, broad base set as much on side as on top of head
cup pointing a bit sideways
follow lines - side of head to chin
heavily furnished, lynx tips desirable



BODY



Body: Solidly muscled - well balanced - moderate length

- Substantial bone structure
- Broad chest - considerable girth - Depth to flank
- Males large/imposing - Females more refined or similar

Legs: Medium; hind higher than shoulders; high rump

- Heavily muscled thighs
- Straight back legs; front paws appear to “toe out”
- Paws – large, round w/ tufting

Tail: long, bushy, broad at base

- Guard hairs desirable



COAT

- Distinguishing – double coat
- Dense undercoat
- Long, glossy guard hairs hanging down sides
- Bib - Short neck collar, side mutton chops & frontal ruff
- Britches full - hind legs
- Fuller in winter
- Softer coats (shaded, solid & bicolors)
- Type & quality of primary importance



PATTERN

- **Every color and pattern; tabby patterns should be clear**
- Exceptions – showing hybridization (chocolate, sable, lavender, lilac, cinnamon, fawn, point-restricted or these w/ white)

DISQUALIFY



- Severe break in nose
- Square muzzle
- Whisker pinch
- Long rectangular or cobby body
- Incorrect number of toes
- Crossed eyes
- Kinked or abnormal tail
- Delicate bone structure
- Malocclusion – under/overshot chin
- Evidence of hybridization (chocolate, sable, lavender, lilac, cinnamon, fawn, or point restricted - Himalayan-type markings or these with white)
