


OCICAT

We only look wild...




THE QUINTESSENTIAL OCICAT

- Medium to large, wellspotted, moderate type
- Athletic, well-muscled and solid, graceful and lithe
- Alert with good vitality
- Twelve accepted colors



Point Distribution

OCICAT



HEAD

- Modified wedge with gentle rise
- Broad muzzle, square with good length
- Moderate whisker pinch
- Ears alert and set at a 45 degree angle
- Eyes large and almond shaped, an eye width apart



BODY

- Medium to large cat with surprising weight for its size
- Ribs slightly sprung, level back
- Structure and quality over size
- Legs should be medium-long, powerful
- Feet oval and compact
- Tail medium long and tapered




COAT

Coat short, smooth and satiny


- Never woolly
- All hair is ticked

 Each hair is long enough to show bands of color



PATTERN

- Broken tabby "M" on the forehead
- Broken bracelets on the lower legs and broken necklaces at the throat
- Large, well-scattered, thumbprintshaped spots on the torso, ideally in a bulls-eye shape
- Belly well-spotted
- Penalize spots in a mackerel pattern



COLOR & CONTRAST

- Color clear and pleasing
- Darkest color is found on the tail tip
- Tail tip determines color
- Clear markings showing good contrast



Penalize faint or blurred spotting

COLORS

Tawny

- Ebony silver
- Chocolate
- Chocolate silver
- Cinnamon
- Cinnamon silver

Blue

- Blue silver
- Lavender
- Lavender silver

Fawn

Fawn silver







DISQUALIFY

- Locket or spotting
- Kinked or otherwise deformed tail
- Blue eyes
- Incorrect number of toes
- Long hair
- No reds or creams
