- 3. The Treasurer to provide the full Board a monthly condensed report to make sure that every Board member is fully informed. **Motion Carried.**

(5) <u>CENTRAL OFFICE OPERATIONS.</u>

Mr. Eigenhauser moved to adopt the following out-of-region show request:

• Tonkinese Breed Association (Region 3) to hold a show in Wayne MI (Region 4) on August 15/16, 2009. **Motion Carried.**

Ms. Johnson moved to follow our current policy and approve the following request:

• The Enchanted Cat Fanciers (Region 8) show licensed for December 10, 2006 has asked to add 3 co-sponsors: Ancient Capital Cat Society (Region 8), Keystone Cat Fanciers (Region 4) and Portland Cat Club (Region 2). All four officers for Keystone CF reside in Japan and 3 out of 4 officers for Portland CC live in Japan. However, the clubs have not been out-of-region for 5 years so the official regions are still Region 4 and 2 respectively. The Regional Directors for Regions 4 and 2 have approved this request, however, the current Regional Director for Japan has not and asked the matter of allowing the out-of-region co-sponsors be brought to the Board. **Motion Carried.**

Ms. Angell moved to adopt the following out-of-region show requests:

• National Birman Fanciers (Region 1) to hold a show in Temple TX (Region 3) on May 26/27, 2007. **Motion Carried.**

Ms. Johnson moved to allow Central Office to transfer a cat back to the breeder in the case of an "account closed" payment and retrieval of the cat, who was at large. **Motion Carried.**

Ms. Miller moved to interpret our Constitutional requirement for written declarations signed by the candidate to include declarations via electronic signature sent by electronic scanned file or via fax. **Motion Carried. Mr. Eigenhauser** moved to accept protests in the same manner. **Motion Carried.**

Mr. Eigenhauser moved that for purposes of our breed council membership, a breed committee chair in another association is not an officer of that association. **Motion Carried.** Johnson, Shaffer, Calhoun, Angell, Janosik, Barnaby, Kusy and DelaBar voting no. **Ms. Johnson** moved to charge herself and **Ms. Wilson** to write a board-sponsored Constitutional amendment for new requirements for breed council secretary eligibility. **Motion Carried.**

Mr. Newkirk moved to abide by our current rules which state that any judge who judges for another organization, recognized or unrecognized by CFA, is not allowed to belong to our breed council. **Motion Carried.**

Mr. Barnaby moved to accept the resignation of the Gilt Edge Burmese Cat Fanciers (Region 6). **Motion Carried. Mr. Barnaby** moved to reinstate the Superstition Cat Fanciers (Region 3), and reject the letter of resignation. **Motion Carried.** Eigenhauser abstained.

Mr. Eigenhauser moved to stop issuing Breeder Bucks effective December 31, 2006, and extend the redemption of Breeder Bucks to April 30, 2007. **Motion Carried.**

Mrs. Baugh moved to accept the following name change:

Consecutive steps from apprentice, approval pending to fully approved must be met by all applicants accepted into the Judging Program, regardless of how much experience they had in judging in a similar association.

Applications from persons who are or have been judges in similar associations within any CFA region will be considered for initial application by the Judging Program Committee. All such applicants, whatever their background, will be required to prove their proficiency by completing breed/division color class evaluations when accepted to the CFA Judging Program by vote of the Executive Board at a regularly scheduled Executive Board meeting. We have an ongoing problem with show catalog addendums. We average maybe two a week which may not sound like a lot but each one entails quite a bit of attention and decisions, usually to the unhappiness of the exhibitor and/or show committee. We score them and there is no question. The fee should be high enough to discourage clubs from taking an addendum without a great deal of thought.

6. A kitten is assigned to the region of the permanent residence of the owner(s) of record on the date that the kitten reaches 4 months of age. In the event that there are two or more owners of the kitten on the date that the kitten reaches 4 months of age, and the owners reside in or maintain residences in multiple regions, the owners must choose the region of one of the owners. In each case, the assigned region for any kitten is reported to the Central Office by listing the assigned/selected region in the catalog in the first (and subsequent) shows in which the kitten is entered. To be

Paragraph 6 assigns the region of competition for regional awards based on the owner's selection of the last show that the kitten competes in before the first full show weekend in January versus the region that the kitten has competed in for a significant number of judging rings.

eligible to receive a regional award, a kitten with owners residing in multiple regions must have competed as a kitten in a minimum of four shows in the selected region. The assigned or selected region is also referred to as the final assignment and as used in the other paragraphs in these rules.

The resolution addresses the regional assignment for kittens before and after the first fill show weekend in January in Paragraph 6, and the references to kittens should be stricken from this paragraph. The best measure of merit for a kitten is that obtained by considering many competitions against the kittens in the region where the kitten is primarily shown and not in the region where one competition was

conducted. Most exhibitors know this and voluntarily choose to compete for regional awards in their region

of residence. Unfortunately, some exhibitors choose to exploit the rules and choose to show their kitten one time in a region where the points they have earned elsewhere will allow them to obtain a win they could not achieve in their own region at the expense of the exhibitors of another region. This allows exhibitors from regions with many shows and large counts to displace regional wins earned by exhibitors in regions with fewer shows and small counts. Requiring that a kitten with owners in multiple regions be shown at least 4 times in the selected region will help verify that the kitten is competitive against the local competition in the selected region and will require that the owners provide some level of financial support to the clubs of the region in which they are competing for the regional win. Kittens have a shorter show season than cats in championship and premiership and in the majority of cases, the kittens that had competed prior to the transfer of a new kitten into the region will have passed the age limit for the kitten class

 - Violation of CFA Constitution, Article XV Section 4 (a & g)

GUILTY on both counts. Sentence of life suspension of all CFA Services.

- 06-025 CFA v. Rasmussen, Janet
 - Violation of CFA Constitution, Article XV Section 4 (a & g)

GUILTY on both counts. Sentence of life suspension of all CFA Services.

06-027 CFA v. Mie Takahashi, Keiko Tadokoro and Hiroko Totsuka Violation of CFA Constitution, Article XV Section 4 (b & g)

As to Mie Takahashi: GUILTY on both counts. Sentence of one year suspension of all CFA Services and a \$1,000 fine.

As to Keiko Tadokoro: GUILTY under CFA Constitution, Article XV, Section 4(g) but dismiss 4(b). Sentence of six months suspension of all CFA Services and a \$500 fine.

As to Hiroko Totsuka: GUILTY under CFA Constitution, Article XV, Section 4(g) but dismiss 4(b). Sentence of six months suspension of all CFA Services and a \$500 fine.

O6-028 CFA v. Crandall-Seibert, Nikki; Duthler, Melissa and Furever Friends Feline Fanciers Violation of CFA Constitution, Article XV Sections 2(c) and 4 (f & g) Violation of CFA Show Rules 2.11, 4.07, 13.04, 14.06, 15.01 and 17.04(c) GUILTY on all counts, including "conduct detrimental" based on a pattern and practice of misconduct. Sentence of each party being barred from show production in any manner (including but not limited to: entry clerking, ring clerking, master clerking, participating on a show committee, licensing a show,

etc.) for a period of one year commencing January 7, 2007¹ and a fine of \$500 each.
